- Compiling a list of all program-level assessments that faculty use for the college's 129 programs of study;
- Having faculty complete course to program-level outcomes maps in order to help define the role that each required course plays in each program of study;
- Revising the College's institutional-level outcomes (known as College Wide Abilities, or CWAs) <u>http://www.edcc.edu/cwa/</u>);
- Developing rubrics to help assess the new CWAs;
- Aligning (a) course-level outcomes and (b) programlevel outcomes with the new CWAs;
- Providing a formal structure (known as the SIMPLE Plan) for faculty to report program-level assessment and evaluation efforts. This work has been undertaken to develop degree assessment in areas that previously did not formally or systematically assess their degrees and certificates. The SIMPLE Plan also reflects a cultural shift in two ways: (1) It shows that Edmonds has begun to systematically gather information from all areas of the college to identify successes, needs, and opportunities for improvement, and (2) it is the product of an identified need to coordinate College-wide tracking, assessing, and reporting efforts so that they can better inform strategic planning and resource allocation.

- Revising the College Course Proposal (CCP) computer system to better capture and track the assessment of outcomes at all levels (i.e. course, program, and institution); and
- Implementing a far-reaching faculty professional development program regarding outcomes assessment. This work has included dedicated release time for a full time faculty member to organize and offer faculty professional development opportunities; faculty attendance at IUPUI's

Assessment Institute; faculty non-instructional days dedicated to assessment-related activities; implementation of Quality Matters and Getting Results in several academic departments; and dedicated release time for a full time faculty member to work with faculty on outcomes development and assessment.	
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
