Letter from the Executive Director

Community Neighbors-

The 2019-2020 school year was a very unusual and challenging year. The program closed in-class services in March of 2020 due to the COVID-19 virus outbreak. Around the same time the program had a Human Resource finding that had to be addressed.

The program staff met these challenges head on with equanimity and valor. They were able to switch gears to virtual learning four days a week and complete virtual home visits. Along with this, staff delivered homework packets to support virtual learning.

Our kitchen staff partnered with school districts to offer free bagged meals at our sites to anyone in our community 0-18 yrs. during COVID. This drive through system worked out to be a mutual benefit for school districts and families in our community. These unsung heroes and sheroes (kitchen staff) distributed over 50,000 bagged meals since the start of COVID!

We look forward to a more "normal," less eventful school year for next year.

Our Program Services...

Head Start

Child development and family support services available for children ages 3 to 5 who are low-income and reside in Snohomish County. Services include comprehensive preschool, home visits, parent and child activities, health screenings, meals, opportunities to volunteer, and parent involvement activities. Part day preschool classes 4 days a week to help support school readiness.





Early Head Start—Home Base

Our Early Head Start program serves families with children birth to three years in a Home Base model. Home Base involves weekly home visits that offer child development activities to help enhance school readiness goals at an early age.

The home base program also offers monthly socialization events for each family. Group socializations are a time that parents and their children can come together and focus on interacting with each other while participating in age appropriate activities.

Parent Involvement

We need parents and family members to become involved in the program to ensure strong parent leadership in guiding the direction of the program We encourage parents to visit their child's classroom, become a program volunteer, attend parent meetings, and work with your child at home. We believe that parents are their child's first teacher.

Edmonds College Head Start/ECEAP & Early Head Start knows that healthy children are happy, learning children. Some requirements of our program are to complete developmental assessments, track well-child exams and health screens for every child. These assessments have helped many children receive much needed services and resources that might have otherwise gone unnoticed. We know that the earlier a child receives services, the more successful they will be in school.
