Community Neighbors-

Edmonds College Head Start/ECEAP & Early Head Start began the 2021-2022 school year offering in-class learning. COVID-19 pandemic required masking and brought other challenges such as vaccine requirements. These challenges resulted in staff leaving which created a staffing shortage. Our staff rose to the challenge and we have been operating at approximately 85% of capacity.



President Biden awarded American Rescue Plan funds to Head Start programs to help communities get back to work and recover from the pandemic. Edmonds College— Head Start program has plans to use these funds to open a childcare center in Lynnwood. Affordable, quality childcare continues to be an issues for working families in Snohomish County. This center is slated to be open in fall of 2023.

Our Program Services...



Head Start /ECEAP

Child development and family support services available for children ages 3 to 5 who are low-income and reside in Snohomish County. Services include comprehensive preschool, home visits, parent and child activities, health screenings, meals, opportunities to volunteer, and parent involvement activities. Part day and school day preschool classes, 4 days a week to help support school readiness.

Early Head Start—Home Base

Our Early Head Start program serves families with children birth to three years in a Home Base model.

Home Base involves weekly home visits that offer child development activities to help enhance school readiness goals at an early age.


The home base program also offers monthly socialization events for each family. Group socializations are a time that parents and their children can come together and focus on interacting with each other while participating in age appropriate activities.



Parent Involvement





School Readiness!

Edmonds Community College Head Start & Early Head Start strives to achieve high standards in our services to children and families. Therefore we have set school readiness goals so that children leave our program with skills and competence in the following areas:

- -Positive Approaches to Learning
- -Social Emotional Development
- -Language/Literacy Development

- Improved Cognition
- Physical/Motor Development

Our program tracks children's growth and development in these areas with a data base tracking system that aligns with Washington State public school system. We work closely with public schools for a smooth kindergarten transition which helps to ensure that children are ready for Kindergarten!

Quality Programming

- 95% Preschool Teacher have an Associates or Bachelor's Degree in Early Childhood
- 60% Teachers in Home Base have a BA Degree in Social Work
- 95% of all teaching/home visiting staff have more than 5 years' experience with our program.

Healthy, Growing Children

Edmonds Community College Head Start & Early Head Start knows that healthy children are happy, learning children. Some requirements of our program are to complete developmental assessments, track well-child exams and health screens for every child. These assessments have helped many children receive much needed services and resources that might have otherwise gone unnoticed. We know that the earlier a child receives services, the more successful they will be in school.


