



Scholarships: Before You Begin

The purpose of this document is to give you an overview of the key details, qualifications, and process to apply for Foundation scholarships.

Key Details

- One application gives you access to over 100 scholarships.
- The number of scholarships awarded varies based on available funding.
- Most awards range from \$1,000 - \$5,000.
- The application period is **February 1, 2025 - March 30, 2025**.
- Late applications are not accepted.
- Foundation scholarships can only be used at Edmonds College. They do not transfer to other schools.

Minimum Qualifications

You are eligible to apply if you meet the following requirements:

- You are enrolled or planning to enroll in a Certificate Program, Associates of Arts (AA) Degree program, or Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) Degree program at Edmonds College for the 2024-2025 academic year.
- You have a minimum 2.0 GPA.
 - Most scholarships have a minimum 2.5 GPA requirement to qualify.
- You will NOT be in the Running Start program for the 25-26 academic year.

What You Will Need

- **Time:** Set aside time to write your essays and get all of the necessary documents.
- **Technology:** You will need access to the internet to apply.
- **Edmonds ctLink Identification number:** Call Enrollment Services at 425.640.1459 to get your SID if you do not know it. If you are a prospective student and do not have a ctLink ID, you can still apply.
- **Unofficial Transcripts:** Enrolled students can find this information in ctLink in the Student Self Service section under the "Academic Records" tile. For more help with this, visit <https://tinyurl.com/ymryb6r4>
 - All other students must submit unofficial transcripts from their most recent institution. Remember to give yourself plenty of time to get this!

Steps

- Determine if you meet the minimum qualification requirements.
- Gather the required information and documentation, such as transcripts, needed to complete the application.

- Draft a response to each essay question in the Academic Learning & Reflection section, Financial Need section, and Planning for the Future section.
 - Recommendation: Write your draft in a separate document for easy editing before adding your answer to the online application.
- Review, proofread, and edit your essays.
