## ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made the 2 day of March, 2011.

#### BETWEEN:

(hereinafter called "TRU")

#### **AND**

## EDMONDS COMMUNITY COLLEGE

With a mailing address of 20000 68<sup>th</sup> Avenue West Lynnwood, Washington 98036 USA

(hereinafter called "ECC")

#### A BACKGROUND

- A.1 TRU is an accredited and degree granting university operating in Kamloops, BC, Canada.
- A.2 ECC is an accredited college operating in Lynnwood, Washington, USA
- A.3 ECC offers to its students the following program:
  - Associate of Arts Degree (hereinafter called "ECC Program")
- A.4 TRU offers to its students the following programs:
  - Bachelor of Arts Degree (hereinafter called "TRU Programs")

#### **B** OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this Agreement include, but are not limited to:

- B.1 Ensuring access by eligible students of ECC Program to TRU Programs.
- B.2 Establishing criteria to determine eligibility of ECC students to TRU Programs.
- B.3 Determining the transferability and applicability of certain courses offered by ECC to TRU Programs.

B.4 Establishing processes to encourage, review and expand, as appropriate, this Agreement between TRU and ECC.

### C AGREEMENT

- C.1 TRU agrees to accept ECC students who meet the criteria set out in Schedule A of this Agreement. Such acceptance is subject to there being seats available in the TRU Programs when ECC students apply.
- C.2 Both ECC and TRU agree to encourage ECC students to participate in this articulation program by providing information and assistance to prospective transfer students.

  Appendices A and B to this Agreement provide information on the TRU Program requirements, and on selected ECC courses and their transferability to the TRU Programs.
- C.3 Both ECC and TRU will designate a program representative at its respective campus to facilitate coordination of this Agreement.

### D TERM OF AGREEMENT

- D.1 This Agreement will become effective on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 2011 and shall have a term of **five** years, and will automatically renew thereafter on a year-to-year basis unless at least twelve (12) months notice of termination in writing is provided by either party to the other.
- D.2 In the event of the termination of this Agreement under Section D.1, both parties acknowledge and agree that, subject to Section C.1 above, all students enrolled in the ECC Programs as at the date of the written notice of such termination shall be entitled to admission to the TRU Program under this Agreement despite its termination upon their graduation from ECC so as to ensure the fulfillment of the reasonable expectations of such students.
- D.3 Each institution must notify the other as early as possible as to material changes to curriculum of the ECC Programs or the TRU Programs as the case may be. Depending on the nature of the curriculum change, adjustments to Schedule A of this Agreement may be necessary.
