




Get money for college: Apply for a scholarship!



- Plan to (or have already) filed the FASFA or WASFA





New! Mental Health Technician Certificate

Edmonds CC now offers a new 41-credit certificate for those interested in mental health treatment. Mental health technicians function as part of a treatment team, providing continuous patient care, supervision, interaction, and role modeling to patients ranging in age from adult through geriatrics.

You'll learn the foundational knowledge and skills to effectively work with individuals in behavioral health care environments. Graduates attain skills for entry-level employment settings such as hospitals, group homes, dementia facilities, and other programs where monitoring of behavioral health is required.
